Assistive TECH

You've seen them while browsing in the grocery store, on your concert ticket, and in countless other places in our daily lives—those mysterious black and white squares covered in a geometric pattern.

They are QR codes!

A convenient tool that's been around for more than twenty years, Quick Response (QR) codes are named for how they instantly provide large amounts of information. It's easy to upload them to any smart phone or tablet.

- 1. OPEN the camera on your device.
- 2. POINT the camera so the QR code appears and hold it there.
- 3. TAP the link that pops up on the screen.

If your device cannot read the QR code on its own, a free app that will do the job is available in the App Store.

QR codes are also important as Assistive Tech (AT) for people experiencing disabilities. Whether it's to aid in ordering food to eat, providing a verbal cue instead of a person, or help in transitioning tasks, these codes can be life changing.

Here at Living Opps, this and other AT can offer increased independence. As we welcome the next generations, QR codes can engage and support people in ways that utilize devices they are already comfortable with.

For example, when a QR code is printed on a business card or resume, one can easily convey their professional skills to possible employers without using verbal language. While on the job, QR codes can offer

independence by opening apps that display tasks, schedule reminders, dial phone numbers, and more. It appears the applications for QR codes can enrich everyone's lives.

Spotlight on Success!

Serene scenes of surrealism. Patterns applied with patience. Colors coalescing with a spark. All this and much more comes to life in the paintings of Mieke Ryneal.

Witnessing someone truly immersed in their creative process is a rare and inspiring opportunity. What's more is to behold their finished artwork. It is a privilege to be surrounded by passionate artists everyday here at The Studio in Downtown Medford. We are proud to feature one such artist, Mieke Ryneal, who has been a prolific part of our community, selling 87 paintings since joining our program.

"Art brings me such joy. It is who I am. This is what I was born to do." Mieke's joy is palpable. You feel it in the dreamy, glowing images she produces. Her work often features pointillism, a technique deployed by the masters that utilizes a wooden stick to painstakingly create thousands of dots of color. Nationally recognized, Mieke has received the Award in Excellence from the VSA Emerging Young Artists Program and her art has been displayed at the Kennedy Center as well as the Smithsonian Institute.

The pandemic brought challenges to everyone. Its impact was deeply felt here at The Studio at Living Opportunities. "I really miss the Studio," says Meike. "I love to paint, it's my happy place. I really miss sharing my paintings with everyone. At least I get to share my art with Dan on video chat which is really great. Every morning when I wake up, I'm hoping the Studio will be open today."

Although we all found ways to thrive through the pandemic setbacks, The Studio is very happy to be opening up again. On October 2nd, we held our 11th annual furnARTure event, live and in-person, where Mieke's latest creation "Into the Light" was a featured piece. She graced the stage to speak with vulnerability, authenticity, and strength. There wasn't a dry eye or untouched heart in the room as she relayed her story of overcoming adversity as a young person, and finding healing and hope in her artist community. Meike said it has all been a blessing, shaping the person she is today and fostering the gift of creativity. Her new painting shows a beautiful forest of aspens, dappled with abstract light formed by her signature pointillist style.

"Trees, just like us, are constantly changing and made up of all shapes, sizes and colors. I think people take them for granted and I'd be really upset if I didn't see them every day." In an awe-inspiring display of receptivity for her message and gifts, "Into the Light" sold for \$25,000 during the live auction!

The experience was almost overwhelming for Meike, she is still "dancing on clouds" of joy. The best feelings ever were the celebrations and happy-tears shared with her mother and all of her friends at Mountain Meadows. A success so very well-deserved and achieved. We look forward to Meike's future triumphs, and are forever grateful to share in the joy and creativity of this incredible woman.
