

Dear Friends,

Looking back, 2021 was another year full of surprises—and Living Opportunities continued rolling with the punches. With a transition in leadership, the continued threat of COVID-19, and a national labor shortage, our organization has been resilient. We look to each other, and our strength in a shared purpose, to continue in the work we do.

This past year, we benefited from multiple short term grants that made it possible to focus on the recruitment and retention of our direct support staff. These positions represent the backbone of the services we offer, and they have the greatest impact on delivering our mission and vision. We could never do what we do without our amazing staff. In addition, Bridging Communities received grants for fire relief and COVID response that focused on families with a member experiencing a disability.

In October, we made the decision not to renew our lease on Murphy Road and to move the Administrative Offices to our Ashland site on Normal Avenue. This allows us to take the time to truly assess our needs and look for a permanent site to purchase.

As you know, we have not been able to host an annual fund-raiser since 2019. We are blessed to have a dedicated donor base that has continued to keep us in their thoughts during these trying times.

In November, we honored our beloved Jimmy "G" (Gochenour) on Giving Tuesday. Jim spent 19 years dedicated to the mission at Living Opportunities.

Today, we want to welcome Karlie Vandenbusch and Baylee LaVoie, the newest members of our Board of Directors. Karlie represents a local business partner where she's experienced the pleasure of working with many of our individuals as employees. Baylee served on our Board years ago before becoming our Business and Donor Relations Manager. She retired in 2021, but has returned to the board to offer her unique perspectives and insight. I'm also pleased to announce our new Director of Supported Employment, Tara Mardoll. Tara has worked with us since 2015 and we are excited to see her continue in this new role.

Although we're all experiencing fatigue from the past couple of years, I am optimistic that 2022 holds hope for our organization and community.

Over the past two years, we've all experienced changes in our lives. One of the most significant hardships was dealing with the inability to freely meet with others in social settings. Spending time with friends is paramount to everyone's health and well-being—it's especially vital to people who, at times, experience isolation.

In March 2020, the Studio was closed due to state mandates restricting



While still operating under the limitations and requirements, the artists at the Studio are extremely happy to be back, expressing their creativity through the arts. We are hopeful that in the coming months, we'll be able to fully reopen the Studio to artists and the community.
